What's A Netguide Anyway?

The Reading Public Library is looking for high school students who are interested in the Internet and computer technology to become "Certified Technology Experts" (CTE's), able to work as "Netguides". Students selected to participate in the program will be trained to teach others to use Internet and computer technology. No prior teaching experience is needed.

Sounds Interesting, How do I Become A Netguide?

To become a Netguide you must complete a Netguide application and interview. All successful applicants must complete a three-hour training session. After the training and practice sessions, students must successfully complete proficiency requirements. Each Netguide will be expected to provide technical assistance for at least 4 hrs per month through June 2010.

What's in it for me?

This is a great opportunity to learn about Internet and computer technology for research and recreational purposes. This is a good way to get required service hours for the National Honor Society or any other church or community group. Obtaining a Netguide position also looks great on a college application!
