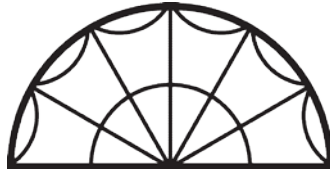

What's a Netguide Anyway?

The Reading Public Library is looking for high school students who are interested in the Internet and computer technology to become "Netguides". Students selected to participate in the program will be trained to teach others to use the Internet and computer technology. No prior teaching experience is needed.

How do I Become A Netguide?

To become a Netguide you must complete a Netguide application and an interview. All successful applicants must complete a three-hour training session. Each Netguide will be expected to provide technical assistance for at least 4 hours per month through June 2012. Many Netguides choose to continue with the program throughout their high school years.

What's in it for me?

This is a great opportunity to learn about the Internet and computer technology for research and recreational purposes. This is a good way to get required service hours for the National Honor Society or any other church or community group. Obtaining a Netguide position also looks great on a college and job applications!
