This is the Children's Room.



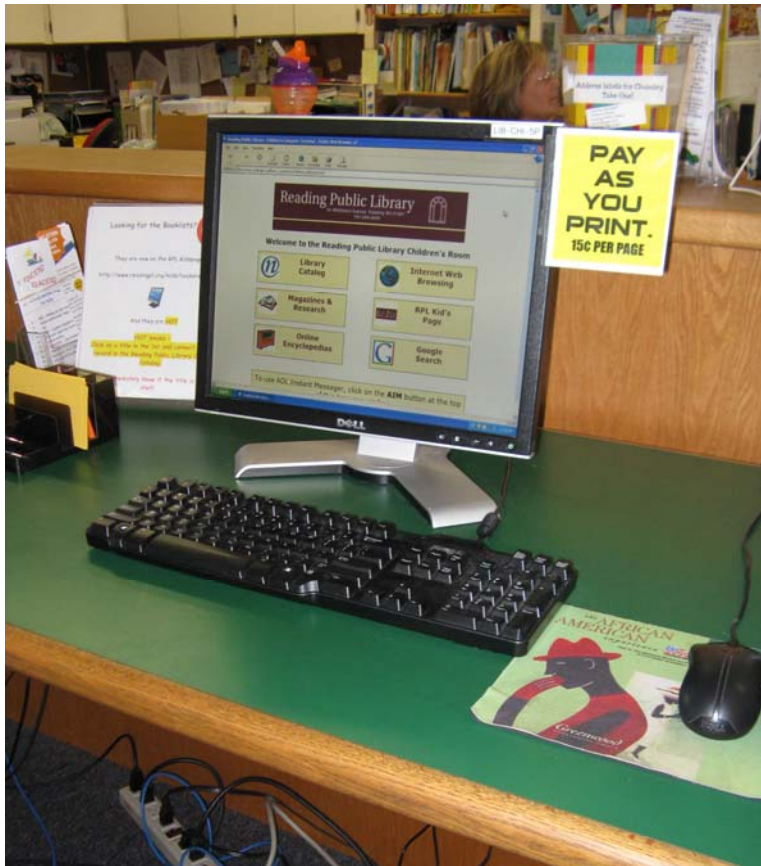
I can get books, magazines, movies, computer games, and music here.

This is where I go to ask the librarian a question if I need help. This is where I get my library card.

My library has computers.



I can play games, look up information on the internet, or do homework.

My library has toys.



I can play quietly in the picture book room.

My library has pets.



I can visit the fish and the gerbil. His name is Chumley.

My library has comfortable chairs.



I can sit and look at a book or magazine.

My library has tables.



I can color a picture, do work, or talk with friends.

This is the Meeting Room.



Sometimes there are special programs in this room, like a sing-a-long, a chess club, a storytime, or a party.

This is the Conference Room.



Sometimes there are storytimes or other programs in this room.

Library books belong to the community.



Another person may want to borrow the book I have. I need to return the book on time so the next person can have it. If I want to keep it longer, I can renew it.

I need to treat library materials carefully.



Library materials are everybody's property and I should treat them with care. I should not tear pages of books, magazines or newspapers. CDs and DVDs should be handled gently. I shouldn't bend, mark or chew on library materials.

This is where I find a book I want.



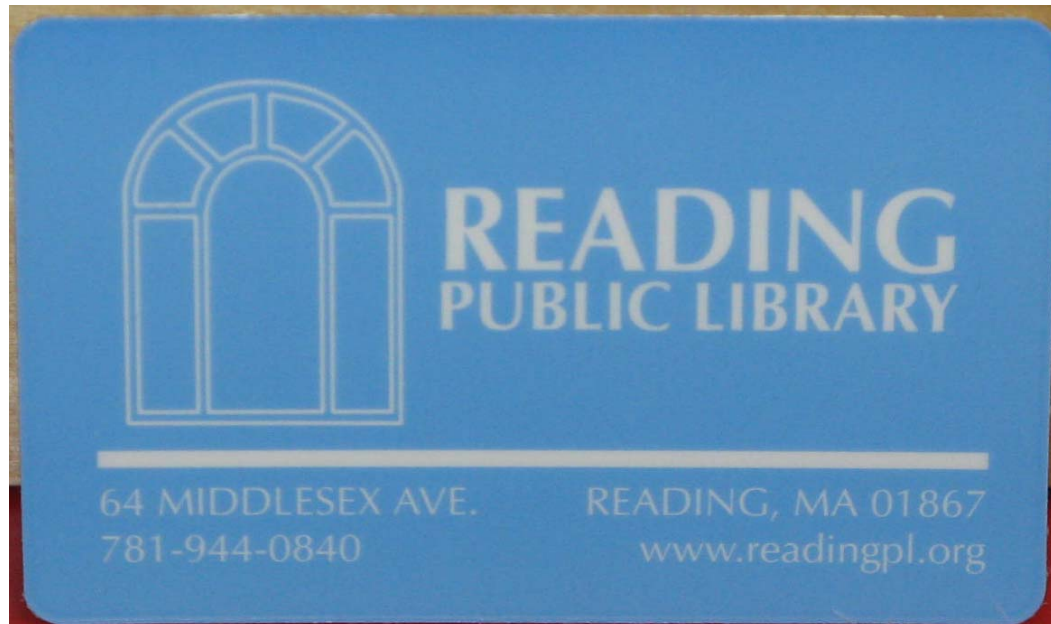
My library is separated into sections. There are books and information categorized in each section. The librarian can help me find the location of the items I am looking for.

This is the circulation desk.



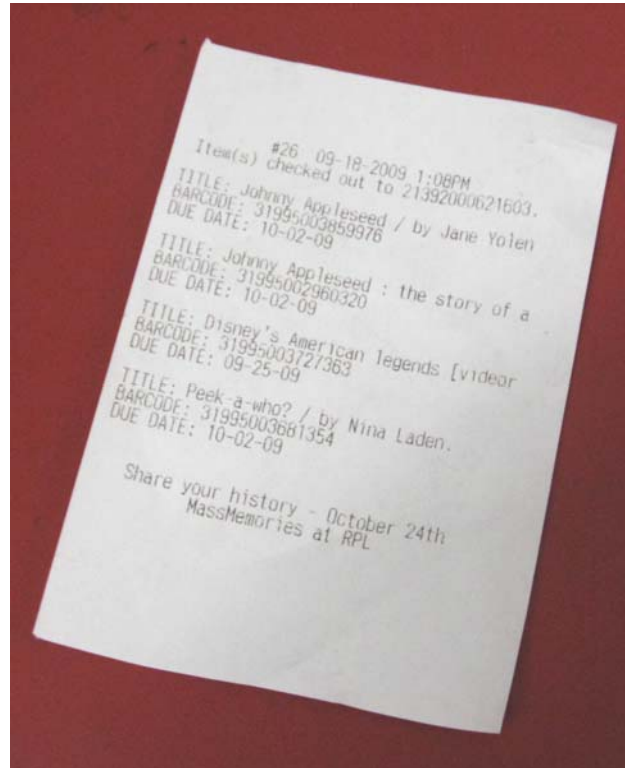
This is where I check out my books or other materials.

This is where I return my library materials when I am finished with them.
